An international and inter-disciplinary conference that brings together new research on temple cultures in South and Southeast Asia. Concentrating on the premodern period but extending into the twentieth century, the papers presented conceive of temple in the broadest possible terms, to encompass *basadi*, *chaitya*, *masjid*, and *prasada*. The aim is to look beyond the monuments to consider their larger social and environmental contexts, and analyze the sensorial, natural, built, and imaginative worlds in which temple makers and users participated. The papers reanalyze current categories for understanding temple cultures, present a thorough reassessment of the state of the field, and point towards developing areas of inquiry.
